

REMOTE LEARNING - PUPIL EXPECTATIONS

1.

The usual classroom expectations and standards of behaviour apply to all remote learning sessions. No silly faces, silly noises or silly messages. 3Cs and 5Rs on show at all times. One person to speak at a time. The School's ICT Acceptable Use Policy must be followed.

2.

You should dress appropriately in day clothes (i.e. no pyjamas, onesies, etc). No food to be consumed during sessions. No pets. Parents of pupils in Years 4 to 8 should not be in the session with you (unless you require specific support with something); this is your learning environment and we are looking to you to demonstrate a high degree of independence. Some children may need more support from parents.

3.

Join each Google Meet/Hangout/Zoom session punctually and follow your timetable.

4.

Ensure your working area is quiet, free from noise and distractions, and that you have all your books and equipment ready, including any resources your teacher has asked you to download or print.

5.

Only the teacher may mute or dismiss anyone from a session and you should not pass on or share the details of a session - it is for the invited people only.

Be silent throughout unless given permission by the teacher.

6.

Ideally, your workplace will be in a suitable room in the house, e.g. dining room, living room, etc. However, we do understand that a desk in a bedroom may be the most suitable, but please ensure as many distractions as possible are removed from the workspace.

7.

Read all tasks and information twice before asking a question and think carefully about what you are asking - everyone else will see what you type.

8.

Your teachers trust you to take part in each lesson sensibly and to complete the work set. Any pupil being disruptive or not participating sensibly will be disconnected by the teacher and parents informed.

9.

If you lose your WIFI connection, try rejoining the session . If this doesn't work, don't panic, as you will be sent work via Google Classroom or email.
