Tips for Reading Together

Children learn best when reading is fun.

- Talk about the title and the pictures on the cover.
- Discuss what you think the story might be about.
- Read the story together, inviting your child to read with you.
- Give lots of praise as your child reads with you, and help them when necessary.
- Try different ways of helping if they get stuck on a word. For example: read the first sound or syllable of the word, read the whole sentence, or refer to the picture. Focus on the meaning.
- Have fun finding the hidden reptiles.
- Re-read the story later, encouraging your child to read as much of it as they can.

Children enjoy re-reading stories and this helps to build their confidence.

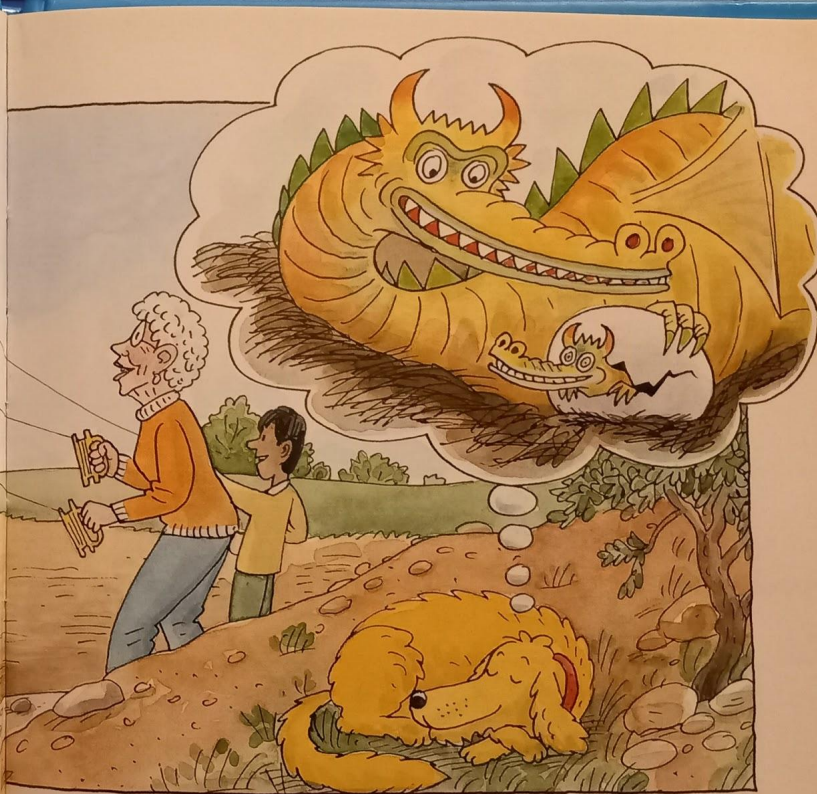
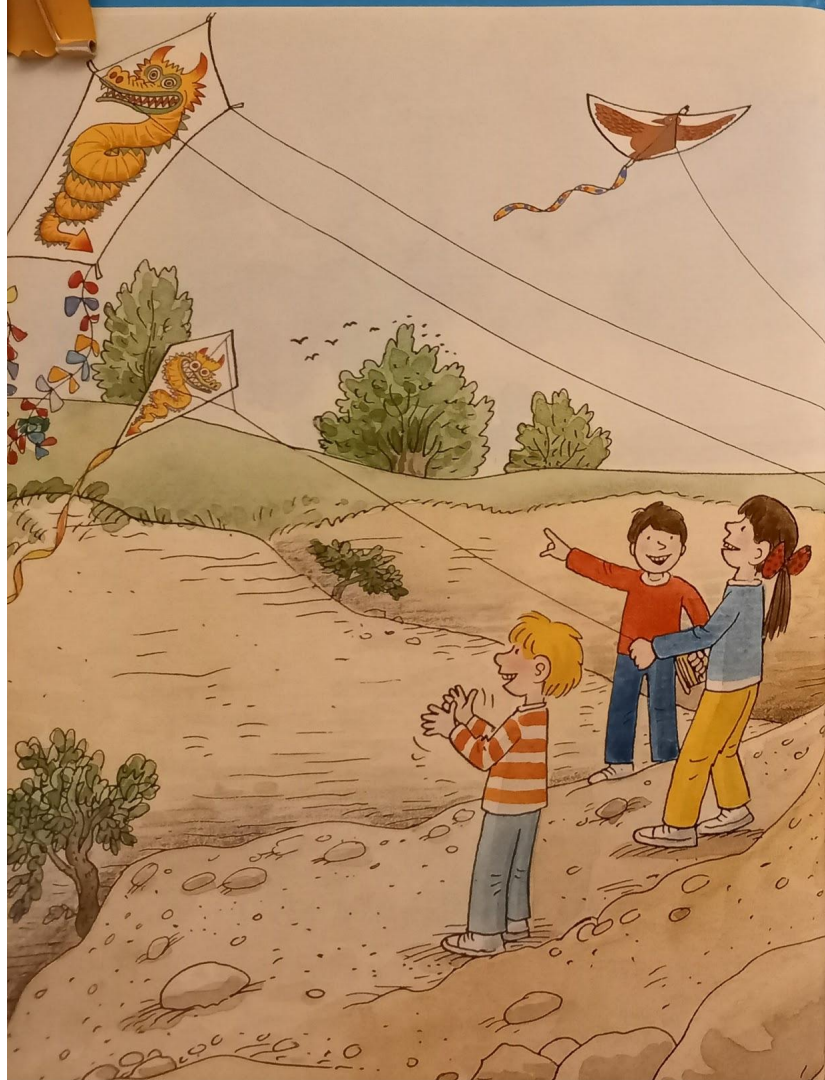

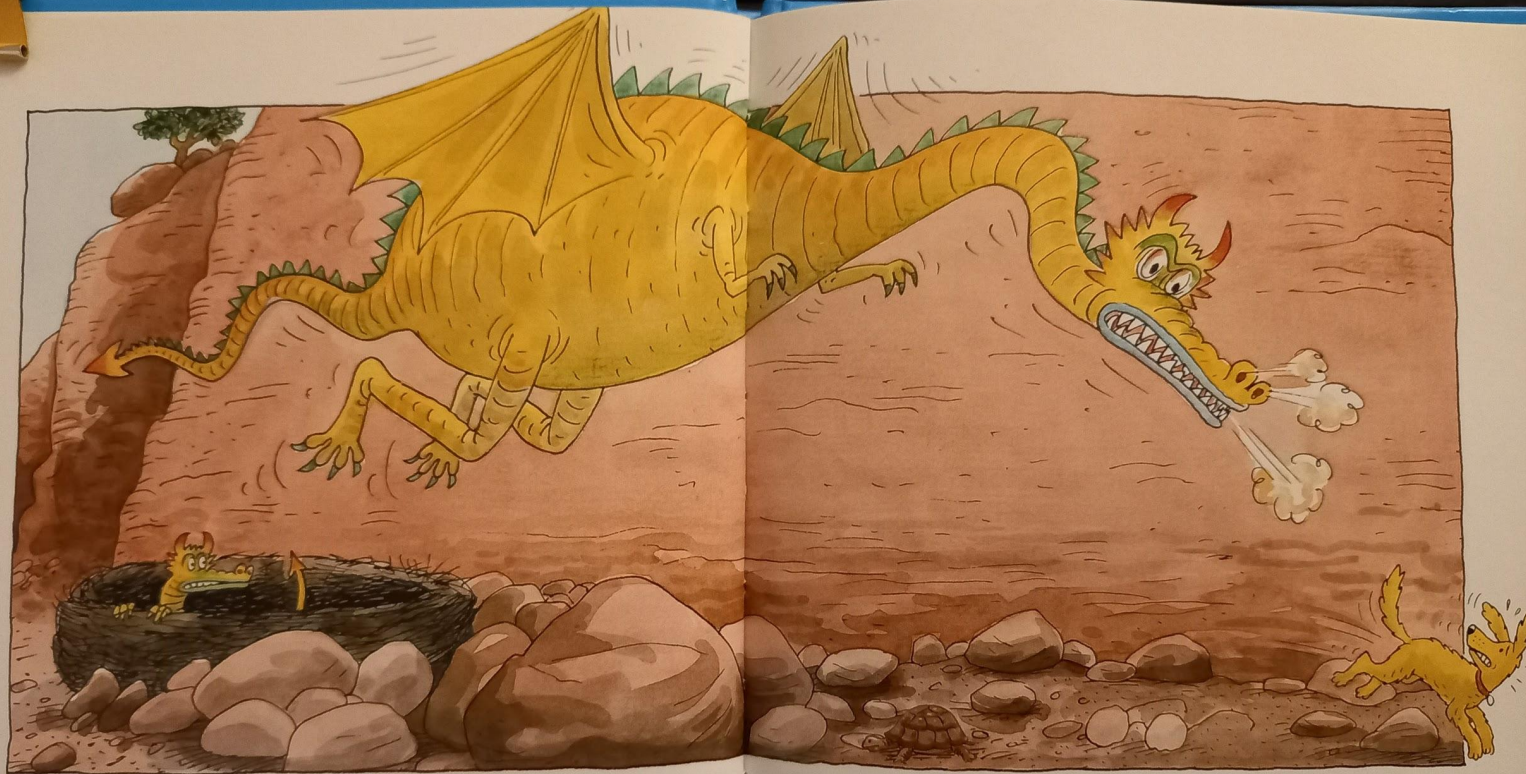
Floppy was dreaming about dragons.

“Go away,” she roared.

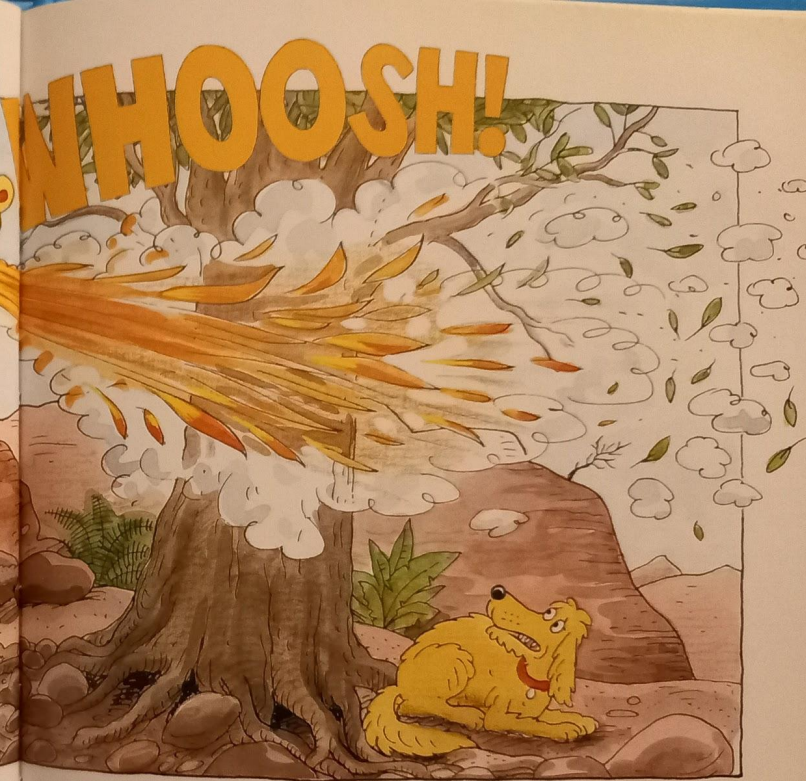


The dragon roared again and

“Oh help!” he said.



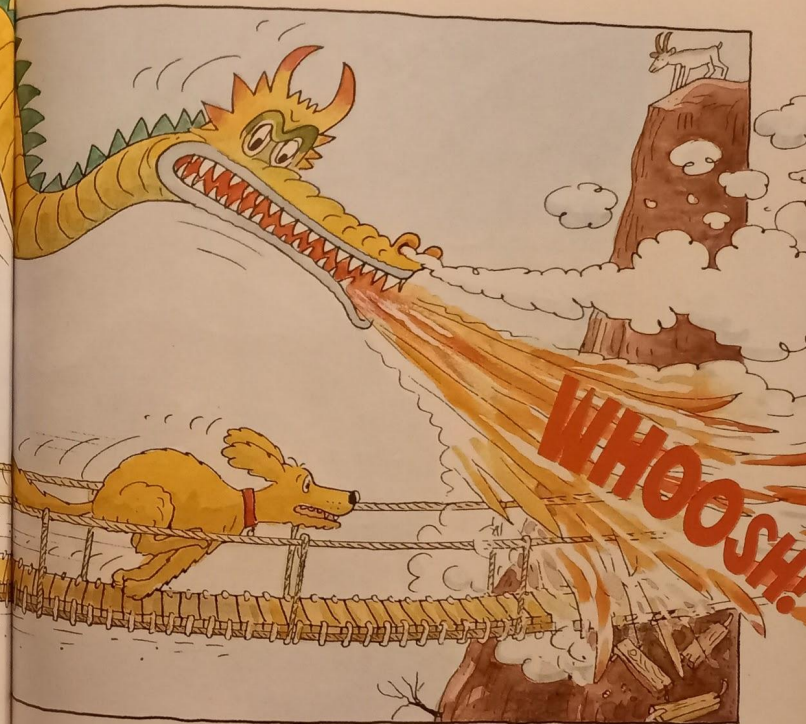
WHOOSH! Flames came out

Floppy ran back across the bridge.



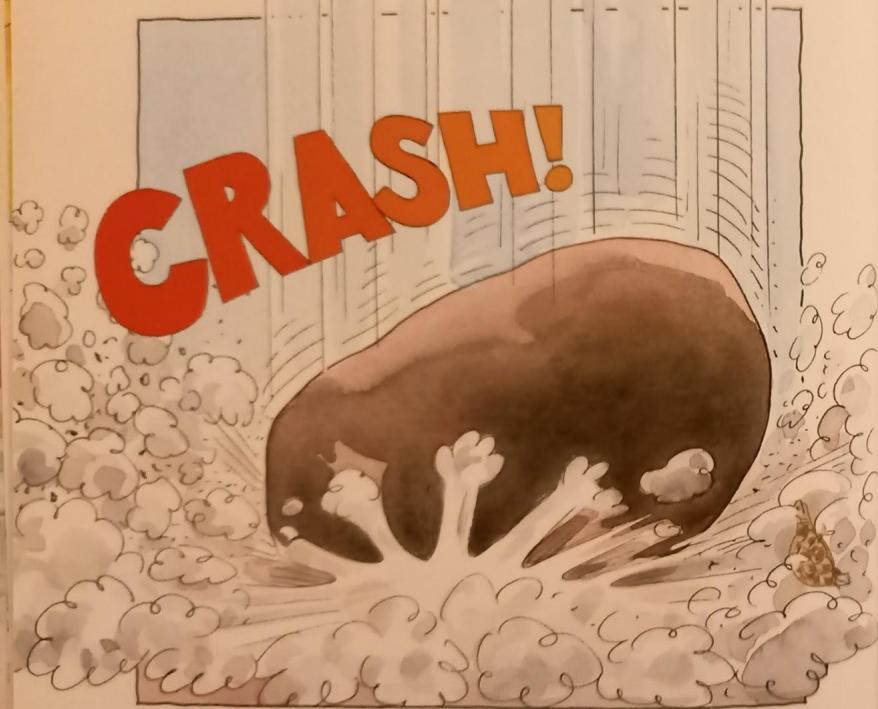
He ran past a rock and saw the baby dragon again.
